BOARD MEETING MINUTES Pittsburgh Area ACI Chapter March 11, 2021

1. Administrative

a. Ladely motioned to approve the 1-26-21 minutes; Donoghue seconded. The motion had unanimous approval.

2. New Business

- **a. ACI Foundation**: The Board discussed contributing to this effort. If agreed upon, it would be a monetary commitment that could be used in the following ways:
 - Fellowship: \$75,000 over 5 years (15k/per year) which sponsors 5 students
 - Scholarship: \$25,000 over 5 years (5k/per year) which sponsors 5 students
 - Research Grant: \$50,000 for one year; used to sponsor a major research project in the industry
 - Annual Fall Appeal Match
 - Million Dollar Challenge

There was no decision or vote made at this time.

- **b. Upcoming Webinars**: There was a discussion about holding webinars over the summer. With the April webinar, the May Virtual Award Banquet, and the July Golf Outing in place, it was a unanimous decision not to plan for anything additional at this time.
- c. Chapter Library: There was a discussion about the benefit of posting the Chapter Library documents to our website. Before doing so, the list of documents would need updated. Ladely plans to contact someone in the Corporate Education Department to ask if they are still offering library documents to Chapters, and what the benefits would be to continue this effort as most documents are now available on-line.

3. Old Business

- a. Chapter Website Redesign: There was a detailed discussion about revising and updating our website. There are several things we need to improve about the site, including adding a Student Chapter page. Jeff Graves, our current webmaster from ID Productions, had given us a proposal for redesign in the amount of \$1,600. Ladely motioned to accept this proposal, providing that we have input and work with Jeff to achieve what we want. Bryan seconded this motion and offered to be the liaison. The motion had unanimous approval.
- **b.** Election Ballot: The ballot will be prepared and sent to the membership by the end of this month. Ladely suggested that we add a photo and brief bio of each candidate on this year's ballot. The final list of nominees for the 2021-2022 election are:

There was a discussion about Andy Lawrence's fees for conducting the Grade I certification classes during COVID. His normal fee is \$1,500 for two-days. The first day being for review and the second for testing. Each session allowing up to 50 registrants. Due to COVID, the sessions for Jan-Mar 2021 were limited to 20 registrants and were one day, for testing purposes only. Because these circumstances are out of our control, and accommodations needed to be made to continue to hold these sessions, Bryan motioned to pay Lawrence the same fee. Ladely seconded. The motion had unanimous approval.
