

MEETING MINUTES

1. Administrative

a. Thomas made a motion to approve the 9-8-21 meeting minutes. Bruner seconded. The motion had unanimous approval.

1. Old Business

- Convention Attendance Ladely discussed the opportunity to attend the upcoming virtual convention (Oct 17-21, 2021). Bryan, DiBucci and Lucarelli plan on participating.
- c. Emerging Leadership Alliance DiBucci was chosen to represent the American Concrete Institute at this year's conference. Joe reported that there were presentations representing many different industries, including mining, steel, concrete. Andy is planning to add an additional flatwork certification due to PennDOT's new requirements that are effective April 2022. It was noted that PACA is working with the NRMCA who offers an Exterior Flatwork Finisher Certification. This certification program has been developed to provide the basic knowledge on best practices for placing and finishing concrete flatwork, typically exterior slabs on ground. This certification does not expire but is not intended for contractors involved in larger projects like construction of large interior floor slabs, streets and local road, mainline paving, or decorative concrete flatwork. Contractors involved in this work should still consider ACI Flatwork Finishing Certification.

SCC: Bryan noted that Concrete Concepts would be willing to host a session.



Adhesive Anchor: PACA will be handling this certification for PennDOT until the board decides how our Chapter wants to handle this certification program.
