1. Administrative

a. Approval of 1-12-2022 minutes. Dave motioned to accept; Reed seconded. Approval was unanimous.

2. Old Business

 - Lifetime Achievement Award Announcement was sent. Deadline is 3/15/22.
 - Distinguished Chapter Service Award Andy Lawrence was nominated for this award in 2020 by Ladely and Thomas. Jennifer Jones, ACI Awards Coordinator, said this nomination is good for three years (2020-2022). Action Item: Ladely sent email to ACI Staff in order to confirm that Andy's nomination is still eligible.
 - Andy's previous chapter award nomination is no longer eligible. Nomination runs for 3 years, then expires. We can re-nominate or nominate a different chapter member. Due date for nomination to ACI is July 2022.
 - Action Item: Carly will work on nomination and reach out as necessary.



- Women in Pittsburgh ACI Wayne Miller suggested recognizing past women who supported the Chapter. After some discussion, it was suggested that Wayne could make a brief announcement at the Awards Banquet.
- Additional Student Awards The Chapter could decide on a larger scholarship or fellowship for bigger impact because we receive limited applications for the Founders Award. Tricia will send additional information to the Board for review and consideration.

e. Finance Committee: Joe DiBucci/Brian Lucarelli

Last month DiBucci reported on member dinner meeting income vs. expenses. He stated that, on average, we are -\$5,000 each year. Lucarelli is currently working on our certification income vs expenses. The plan is to collect the data, review it, and determine where we can make changes to try and break even.

- Dinner meetings:
 - Michigan Chapter \$50/member for dinner meetings. We are significantly below that
 - Incremental increases could cut back to just beer and wine or streamline food
 - Look into member sponsorships (something like \$150/meeting)
 - Suggest bumping up costs of dinner meetings by \$5-\$10 next year to help offset losses

Instruction

- Grade I and Flatwork Andy is OK. Having trouble getting proctors for Grade 1.
- Because Certifications are typically good for 5 years, they renew on a cycle. This year was a low cycle.
- Typical profit: \$175 \$180 / registration. Years with high cycles are more revenue.

New Information: Ladely talked to ACI Staff about the current surplus of funds; what other chapters have done with funds of that size; and options to lease a space for chapter meetings & certifications. Ladely will communicate the suggested next steps if the chapter wants to move forward with possible program and staffing changes.

Directors agreed that the Chapter money should be used for mission work. Education, connection, growth of membership. Ways to spend money:

- Lease a space for ACI Resource Center for testing/webinars. Would require full time staff
 - Concern: how do we pick a location? How do we bridge gap for people at outskirts of chapter (i.e. State College)
 - Would require a task group to look at it from all hours. Would also require tracking of hours for staff



- Find out amount of certifications to justify/fund a PE full-time, and does that demand exist in our region?
- Would need a simple business case, how many years until profitability, association management person who markets the services
- ACI staff has helped stand up 2 resource centers so far. Including details of required square footage.
 - Action Item: a task group will be created to follow up on this
 possibility. Anyone interested in being on task group should email
 Tricia. We want to include perspectives from different members.
 Would be good to have a professor.
- Pro-Bono job in our community once a year
- Habitat-type project
- Scholarships and fellowships
